TOWNSHIP DEVELOPMENT CHARGES

Purpose of Township Development Charges

The purpose of Township Development Charges is to recover the growth-related costs associated with the capital infrastructure needed to service new development. The Council of the Township of Wainfleet passed Bylaw No. 025-2021 on July 27, 2021 under subsection 2(1) of the *Development Charges Act, 1997*.

Development Charge Rules

The rules for determining if a development charge is payable in a particular case and for determining the amount of the charges, are as follows:

- 1. The development charge by-law applies to all lands in the geographic area of the Township of Wainfleet except for lands that are owned by and used for the purposes of:
 - the Township of Wainfleet or a local board thereof;
 - a board as defined in Section 1(1) of the Education Act;
 - the Region of Niagara or a local board thereof.
- 2. The following uses are exempt from development charges under this bylaw:
 - A place of worship exempt from taxation under the Assessment Act;
 - Bona fide farm (non-residential) buildings;
 - A development by a university, other post secondary school offering a degree or diploma recognized by the Province of Ontario or a not-for-profit private elementary or secondary school operated in compliance with Section 16 of the Education Act, as amended, where such development is used for the academic or teaching purposes of the university or school

Services

The services for which residential and non-residential development charges are imposed in the Township of Wainfleet are as follows:

- a) Services Related to a Highway;
- b) Fire Protection Services;

- d) Library Services; and
- e) Administrative Studies

c) Parks and Recreation Services;

Payment of Development Charges

Development charges are payable in full on the date that the building permit is issued in relation to a building or structure on land to which a development charge applies. Please consult with your Local Building Official regarding Building Permit Application and payment of development charges.

Statement of the Treasurer

The Township Treasurer will document the continuity of each Development Charge Reserve Fund on an annual basis, including services covered, development charge collections, draws, interest earnings, money borrowed from a fund and for what purpose, and credit transactions. The Treasurer's Annual Statement may be viewed by the public upon request at the Township Municipal Office.
